IFM Uniform List & Policy

Imagine Foundations at Morningside Public Charter School is a uniform school. A higher standard of dress encourages greater respect for individuals, scholars, and others and results in a higher standard of action. Our dress code guidelines indicate appropriate school dress during normal school days.

Imagine Foundations at Morningside Public Charter School reserves the right to interpret these guidelines and/or make changes during the school year. Scholars are expected to follow these guidelines.

Every scholar in attendance shall wear the school uniform.

Daily Uniform Bottoms

All bottoms must be tan or khaki and must be worn with a belt at the waist unless they have an elastic waist. Absolutely **NO** jeans, leggings, sweatsuit pants, pajamas, logos, insignias, pictures, or messages.

- Shorts Must be worn at knee level.
- Skirts, Jumpers, or Skorts Must be knee level or longer. Polo must be worn under the jumper.
- ❖ Tights Solid color white, navy blue, or black tights can be worn.
- Socks solid color white, navy blue, or black socks are required with skorts or shorts.

Daily Uniform Tops and Sweaters (mandatory)

All polo shirts and cardigan or sweatshirts must have the school logo. School logo polos and cardigan or sweatshirts may be purchased at Flynn O'Hara Uniforms.

- Navy Polo Shirt (Kindergarten 5th Grade)
- Gold Polo Shirt (6th Grade 8th Grade)
- Solid Navy Blue Sweater or cardigan with school logo

Solid colors black, blue, brown, or white shoes are preferred. Shoes must be fully enclosed. No sandals, flip flops, Crocs, open-toe, or open-heel shoes allowed.

Physical Education Uniform


